CRIMELINE ROAD MODULE GUIDELINES

INTRODUCTION

Ever wondered what's it like to be a detective? How Sherlock Holmes always manages to solve crimes? Crime Line Road brings you an opportunity to answer such questions! This event is one of the most challenging and captivating events that Science Bee '17 has to offer. The participants get to showcase their investigative skills, team work and critical thinking by solving a mystery in a high paced and adrenaline filled situation.

So gear up to find the murderer and bring justice to the grieving family. The crime scene is set, the witnesses are awaiting interrogation and the murderer is out there ready to strike again. Who will be the next victim? Will the case be solved in time? Who gets the glory of finding the murderer? Find out at this year's Crime Line Road at NUST Science Bee '17!

Each team will get to:

- Examine the crime scene
- Dust for prints on evidence provided
- Finger print the suspects (in most cases)
- Sift through clues and analyze police reports
- Investigate and grill the detective and suspects

Teams will be provided details of the deceased such as:

- o Personal and professional life.
- o Habits/Hobbies
- o Work and personal relationships

After thoroughly going through the collected evidence, the participants must determine the:

- What
- Who
- How
- Where
- When

Each team would be required to make a complete report which would include details on the murderer, how and why the murder was carried out, the weapon used if any, time of the murder and what led them to the conclusion.

How it works:

1. You will be given an overview of the crime scene and personal and professional life of the deceased and people related to him/her via a video, presentation, a speech or handouts.
2. You will be allowed to examine the crime scene for a limited amount of time. Make the most out of this examination and keep your eyes and minds open.
3. You may have to talk to certain people who are involved in the investigation or were related to the deceased.
4. You should take notes, observe and think effectively to connect the dots; which will ultimately lead you to the culprit(/s).
5. You will be awarded on correct result.

RULES:

- Teams can consist of 3-5 members.
- The whole debacle is a timed investigation, with every team being provided equal and ample amount of time for different clues. Following the time constraints is a must. Failure to do so may lead to disqualification.
- The decisions of ushers on matters during the event are final and to be respected.
- Damaging anything belonging to the building would lead to strict action.
- Questions related to the investigation are to be asked only from the specified executives.
- The investigation is to be carried out only in the specified area inside or outside the building. Participants may not stroll to another place without informing the ushers.
- The participants will be given sufficient time (at least 10 hours) to write their report.
- The judgement criteria will be intimidated on the event day.
